



#### TOP 5 PEDIATRIC DIAGNOSIS



# **DIABETES**




Note: Out of 26,892 adult population who sought medical services, 2,943 (12%) had a diagnosis of Diabetes.

Better Health Monitoring: More health data means better health status monitoring over time.
